Monthly Fund Update / February 2021

The BBH Income Fund Class I ("the Fund") returned -1.09% in February, and the Bloomberg Barclays U.S. Aggregate Index returned -1.44%. Outperformance vs. the benchmark was due mainly to the Fund's larger allocation and better performance in corporate credit.

The 3-7 year portion of the Treasury curve widened an average of 26 basis points¹ in February. Returns in excess of Treasuries (excess returns) for Investment Grade (IG) and High Yield (HY) corporate bonds were 0.65% (IG) and 1.15% (HY) vs. total returns of -1.72% and 0.37%, respectively. Total return for floating rate loans was 0.67%. Asset-backed securities and non-agency commercial mortgage-backed securities returned -0.14% and -1.05%, respectively.

Fiscal stimulus, vaccinations, and the end of lockdowns will support credit fundamentals in the coming months. Indeed, earnings and economic indicators have produced multiple surprises to the upside. Strong economic performance combined with highly stimulative monetary and fiscal policy have caused a Treasury sell-off, turning returns negative in intermediate and long maturities. Selling pressure in longer bonds caused credit spreads to retreat from their record low levels in mid-February. As attention focused on rising rates, the floating rate loan sector had strong inflows and outperformed its peers.

Credit spreads remain near cycle tight, and our valuation model indicates a significantly overheated credit market. We do not welcome a sell-off in credit spreads, but such an event may offer buying opportunities. In any case, we will remain guided by our philosophy of investing in durable credits² only at attractive spreads.
