

BBH Limited Duration Fund

Monthly Fund Update / July 2021

The BBH Limited Duration Fund Class I ("the Fund") returned 0.12% in July, and the Bloomberg Barclays U.S. 1-3 Year Treasury Bond Index returned 0.17%. The Fund's credit performance was positive, but rates tightened, and the all-Treasury benchmark has double the duration of the Fund.

The 1-3-year part of the U.S. Treasury curve tightened by 6 basis points in July. Returns in excess of Treasuries (excess returns) for 3-5-year Investment Grade (IG) and 3-5-year High Yield (HY) corporate bonds were -0.09%(IG) and -0.28%(HY) vs. total returns of 0.55% and 0.01%, respectively. Total return for floating rate loans was -0.01%. Asset-Backed Securities (ABS) and Non-Agency Commercial Mortgage-backed Securities (CMBS) returned 0.21% and 0.93%, respectively.

Companies reported impressive earnings, frequently mentioning inflation, particularly in labor and supply chain constraints. Inflation has been running well above the trend of the last decade, but most sources of inflation appear to be the recovery of pandemic-sensitive sectors. The Fed will likely not change course unless they see full employment or several quarters of inflation surprises. The consensus for a rate hike is late 2022 to early 2023. However, the Fed may discuss tapering at its September meeting. Primary dealers expect the Fed's purchases to begin tapering early next year. Meanwhile, huge fiscal stimulus bills continue to be debated in Washington.

A surge in Covid-19 threatens a curtailment of consumer spending on travel, leisure and dining out. Governments are considering the re-imposition of restrictions on businesses.

Corporate spreads ended wider, reflecting the tension between robust supply, rising risks and historically low compensation for investors. Valuations are broadly unattractive in IG corporate debt, although HY corporate debt offers more value. Compensation in select areas of structured credit remains compelling.

We expect more volatility ahead, as the market sorts out the above risks against minimal investor compensation. We ask our investors to be patient as higher compensation for risk will eventually be available for the investors. Until then we will remain selective in our purchases.
